

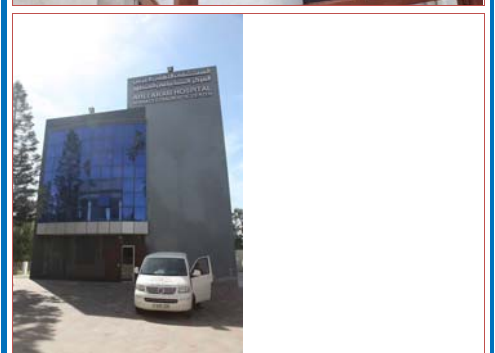

Local community-based organizations, institutions, non-profit organizations and government institutions provide healthcare, education, and social services for the population. Gaza's population of 2 million people is largely considered aid dependent; nearly 80 percent of the population relies on social assistance and nearly 40 percent of those are still living below the poverty line. The Al-Ahli Arab Hospital was established in 1882 by the Church of Mission Society (CMS) of England later becoming the service ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem in 1982. The community is supportive of this private hospital as it offers quality medical treatment and care including in-patient and out-patient care, preventive medicine, a rehabilitation program for the disabled, and an outreach program that delivers medical care and food for 500 children and women who have no proper access to health services in their area or are food insecure.

## Project Description

Each year, thousands of Palestinian residents in the Gaza Strip are diagnosed with kidney stones require invasive surgery. Invasive surgery raises the risk of complications, a longer recovery period and is expensive for the average Gazan who must pay out-of-pocket. Al-Ahli Arab Hospital has introduced new advanced type of surgery for patients suffering from kidney stones. This is a new type of advanced surgical procedure not practiced in the public or private sector. The procedure is minimally invasive, requires quicker recovery period. The hospital's urology clinic and department has introduced the procedure which has had an overwhelming number of patients registered for surgery. To meet the growing number of patients, the hospital seeks to expand its urology services. Al-Ahli's head urologist doctor recommends the percutaneous nephrolithotomy (PCNL) equipment which costs a total amount of 13,000 Euros. PMP kindly requests financial assistance from KHS-Holland to procure the PCNL equipment for the surgical procedure, which will serve an estimated 2,300 patients per year.
