### **Description:**

Mother of Mercy Clinic (MMC) is one of the most qualified pre and postnatal clinics in the city of Zerqa, its location in the poverty-stricken city of Zerqa, near refugees' camps added more pressure to its already challenging situation.

The objective of the clinic is to provide quality services in an atmosphere of love, merciful care and generosity to all patients living in Zerqa and the surrounding areas, even for those who are in need are coming from other governorates.

By providing protective, diagnostic, therapeutic and educational services, first they will improve the health status, also will promote in the human development of those poor women and girls who are playing a major role in the life of their families and surrounding society. This will contribute in the development of personal and professional skills of the employees as well.

CNEWA initiated this program since the establishment of the clinic floor within the buildings of the Latin Patriarchate school in 1982, at its' beginning, it was managed by the Franciscan Missionaries of the Divine Motherhood.

In the year 2000, CNEWA invited the Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Sienna, who came from Mosul to run the Clinic in 2001. The three sisters are well educated, and have many years of experience. Currently, one of them is the Sister in Charge, the other is working as a nurse, and the young sister, who completed her Master study at one of the Jordanian universities also works at the clinic, in addition to eight specialized employees, three of them have been working for the clinic since 1988.

The activities, which will fulfil the desired objectives of the Mother of Mercy Clinic, are performed within the several stations at the Mother of Mercy Clinic's floor:

\* The reception area, which is well organized and managed by the receptionist, who is experienced and very well trained to be able to deal with all types of patients, and have great skills to arrange the files in both systems, the hard copy files and digital ones. All needed information for patients' visitation time table are digitally documented. The reception deals with Iraqi, Syrian, and Palestinian refugees, and other nationalities like Bangladesh, Chechen, Pakistani, in addition to few Egyptian workers.

\* The preparation room, where the first station in the medical process, with the well trained and great skilled nurses to prepare the patients for the medical diagnosis by taking the needed measurements of weight, height, and body temperature... any vital signs will also be filled in the patients file along with the general medical and surgical history. Nurses play major role in the health education and give the patients the needed information and instructions to manage their health problems.

\* Laboratory is the third station of the medical process, MMC lab provides the routine and urgent tests, but for the more complicated and other needed tests are performed at outside labs (according to agreement). The lab manager



and technician are highly trained with very good experience to do their job with the best methods. All lab tests, tools, equipment and procedures are monitored regularly by the Jordan Ministry of Health.

\* Dressing room, in this fully equipped room; they do all procedures such as sutures, cauterization, P.V., injection, nebulizer, and burn dressing.

\* The vaccination room is the fifth station; they offer vaccinations as planned by WHO and Jordan Ministry of Health. A well-trained nurse with good communication skills to provide vaccination programs for schoolchildren, and pregnant women. The nurse also provides advices for mothers on how to deal with their babies and the correct behavior during illnesses.

\* The general practitioners room is the sixth station, there are two general physicians, male and female doctors, who are responsible for reviewing patients' medical histories, and doing the general examination to diagnose and administer suitable treatments. This process takes place at the fully equipped rooms, including good ultrasounds to serve male, female, young children and adults with the different complaints.

The general physicians provide regular antenatal care and early childhood, in addition to annual full examination for school students at the Latin school. The doctors also play a major role in health education and health instructions especially those related to mother and child, and the most common diseases.

\* The pharmacy is the seventh station, which provides different multiple types of medications that serves the largest category of patients. The highly needed medications are always available. They purchase the drugs from well-known medical stores and companies in their market prices and sell with lower prices.

Pregnant women, mothers, babies and children, in addition to Iraqi and Syrian refugees are the less fortunate and poorest in the society. Approximately 15,000 - 17,000 patients/year.

### **Request for 2020:**

The clinic purchases laboratory supplies and medicines on monthly basis, which are very expensive, and the medicines considered expensive too for this sect of people, even though discounts and free of charges continue to be provided through the clinic, however, their needs exceed our resources.

Even though the clinic's fees are very humble, and there are too many patients receive the best services for only limited amount of money, but still there are more to be served without any charges, due to their vulnerability, and poverty. Therefore, CNEWA would like to increase its contribution for those people, especially for the laboratory tests and medicines, which are prescribed by the physicians.

With the great support received from the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher in Holland, the clinic managed to purchase the needed lab supplies, to purchase and add more types of medicines to the pharmacy, as seen in the final report 2019. For the year 2020, we would like to repeat our request to continue serving those patients come to the clinic.
